#### FIVE GENERATIONS AT ST. MARYS

My father, Ronald Casey, attended St, Mary's School as a child. As members of the Immaculate Conception parish community, it wasn't a question as to where I was going to start my education. As I recall, that same thinking was shared by nearly all of the church-going families at the time. My memories of St. Mary's School include the sisters that we were educated by in the school's 4 classrooms (2 grades per room). And I must mention Father O'Mahoney, a good Irishman and fine priest who said mass every day and always managed to get over to the school for religion

classes and to give us the day off on St. Patrick's Day! These role models taught us much more than math and science, our education was rich in faith lessons, from Saint Cards that we collected like baseball cards to daily prayer and praise.

After completing my college education, I married my husband, Ray, and we started our family in Erin Prairie, attending St. Patrick's Church. God blessed us with 9 children. While visiting for Sunday dinner, Father McDermott encouraged us to send our children to St. Mary's School. We agreed that this is what we wanted, despite the lack of bus services for parochial students. And so began the Mitchell and Gillen families' shared commute, via station wagon, to and from St. Mary's School each day.

The school was rebuilt during this time, and the sisters now lived upstairs in the new school building. By the time our youngest, Dennis, finished his 8 years at St. Mary's there were less sisters teaching but they were still involved in administration. I know he and many of his peers appreciated Sister Agatha, principal and Phy Ed teacher who loved sports to the point of attending former St. Mary's Students' athletic events at the high school level. As a St. Mary's parent, I always enjoyed seeing our family together in the church and had peace of mind knowing that religion was a part of our children's daily educational experience.

Much has changed since 1937 when I graduated from St. Mary's School, since my children graduated in the 60's & 70's and even since my grandchildren graduated in the 80s, 90s & 2000's. The building was updated in early 2000's, there are no longer sisters involved in teaching or administration, and there are many enhancements in technology and safety that continue to happen in order to keep up with modern educational strategies.

I continue my involvement in the school community and happily support these many changes. I am always impressed with the caliber of the teachers, enjoy learning from the students' science fair projects and wax museum presentations, and experiencing their hospitality during the Catholic Schools Week Alumni Tea. I also enjoy being a part of one child's faith experience as a Prayer Partner. Mardi Gras is another favorite occasion of mine. I believe there is nothing more valuable to a young child's development than the combination of faith and education during his/her formative years. So I choose to give what I can, to support St. Mary School in this important work.

I am excited to be back in the school community as a Great Grandparent. My 4 year old great grandson will begin his education at St. Mary School this fall. For 125 years God has worked through this school to influence many families and generations of students. I have watched these St Mary's students succeed academically and grow into adults who operate with integrity and passion. They go on to do great work and make positive contributions to their communities. I believe their conviction is a direct result of the positive role models, faith-driven friendships, and top-notch Catholic education St. Mary's provided them. I pray for St. Mary School teachers, administrators and students to continue this important work in a time when the world needs God's influence most.
