Did you know? Kids do the silliest things. Did you know that sometimes those silly things are right at their developmental level? Here are just a few examples of common silly things kids do from the book *Yardsticks—Child and Adolescent Development* by Chip Wood:

Kindergarteners—Often fall or slip out chairs sideways

First Graders—Often more comfortable standing while working

Second Graders—Often will sit with head down on desk, often covering or closing one eye

Third Graders—Growth spurts lead to awkwardness in coordination

Fourth Graders—May twist hair, bite nails, or purse lips to relieve tension

Fifth Graders—If not receiving enough physical exercise, energy may spill over into acting out in class

Sixth Grade—Require more sleep at this age than ever before

Seventh Grade—Desire to stay up late leads to wanting to sleep late and results in increased tardiness

Eighth Grade—Due to physical development causing embarrassment leads to silly or rude behavior
