

Students Score High

Spring MAPS scores in Math and Reading are above both the Diocese of Superior and National Mean scores. This is a prime example of the academic excellence that is offered in an education from St. Mary School.

St. Mary School graduates perform at a high level in high school. According to WISEdash Portal (The Wisconsin Information System for Education), the Class of 2016 state average ACT combined score was 18. Those graduates of the New Richmond Class of 2016 who attended St. Mary School average combined ACT score was 28. Each of these students had at least one AP class in high school, but most averaged between 4-6 AP classes.

To provide the best education possible, St. Mary School has reviewed curriculum and purchased new K-8 science, religion, and math textbooks and Catholic Youth Bibles for grades 4-8. These upgrades in materials were made possible by very generous donors at the 2016 Mardi Gras fundraiser and by an anonymous donation.

Students in Service

St. Mary students know the importance of service to their school, parish, community and the world around them. Listed below are just a few of the many service projects the students participated in. Students in 4th-8th grades spent a morning in late October at Feed My Starving Children where they packaged 27,432 meals for children around the world. The entire student body participated in a penny drive during the month of November and raised funds to donate to Five Loaves Food Shelf and Grace Place. In December the Kindergartners did a supply drive for the local animal shelter, Gregory's Gift of Hope. During the month of January in celebration of Catholic Schools Week, the Student Council sponsored an all school food drive. The students and their families donated 437 pounds of food to Five Loaves Food Shelf. The St. Mary Student Council also helped with the Happy Kids Backpack program and served meals at the Wednesday Night Catholic Formation Dinners. The 8th grade class volunteered at the St. Patrick's Day Dinner at Erin Prairie.
