Service projects for students range from donation drives for Gregory's Gift of Hope and Five Loaves Food Shelf to eco-friendly recycling projects. Students visit local nursing homes to spread cheer through music and send hand written letters and cards thanking our civil service workers in the community. Students also make pillow cases for residents at Grace Place Shelter.

Teachers also are part of the commitment to service in the school's mission. Staff and faculty can be seen volunteering at Ruby's Pantry, Five Loaves Food Shelf, Happy Kids Backpack Program, and giving blood at local Red Cross Drives. Service at St. Mary School also extends internationally with a school supply drive for a school in the Dominican Republic and field trips to Feed My

In mid-November the school's 5 foot statue of the Virgin Mary was loaded into Mrs. Jarchow's vehicle as students and staff said a prayer and sang a song of farewell. Mary was then driven to St. Paul Fabrication where the statue would begin a restoration process. Once arriving at St. Paul Fabrication it was learned that the statue was over a 100 years old and was most likely from the original school built in 1891.


The restoration process would repair the broken fingers of the statue, all nicks and dents, and a full repainting of the statue.
