I have been very lucky to be a guest reader in the Kindergarten, First, and Third grade classrooms. We have been learning about how to treat others and be kind to our friends through stories. It is a wonderful time that I get to spend with the classes and is always a highlight of my week.

January Food Drive: The students have been filling my office with donations for Five Loaves Food Shelf. I have challenged the students to donate 750 pounds of donations. If they reach the goal they will receive a non-uniform day, and I will have to wear the school uniform...yes, I have the plaid skirt and everything! If they raise 1,000 pounds they will get a second non-uniform day, and Mr. Measner will wear the school uniform. YIKES! The last day of the food drive will be Friday, February 1st.

Did you know? There are 10 easy ways to raise a more confident reader. PBS kids suggest these ten easy steps to help your child be a more confident reader:

- 1. Read aloud to your children—lays the foundation to helping literacy skills.
- 2. **Have kids read to you**—this will build confidence and self-esteem for when they need to read in front of the class.
- 3. **Have books around the house**—"practice makes perfect" plus according to a 2010 study, having as few as 20 books in the home had a significant impact on whether or not children sought a higher education.
- 4. **Let you kids catch you reading**—seeing you read can impact how your child views reading.
- 5. **Give kids control**—let them pick the stories.
- 6. **Make it part of a daily routine**—pick a time each day so that the kids look forward to reading.

- 7. **Don't be afraid to challenge them**—occasionally choose a book that is above your child's level and help them to read it.
- 8.**Bond over books**—share your favorite stories from when you were a kid. Read one of your child's favorites and discuss it. Get lost in the story, root for the hero, and boo the villain.
- 9. Avoid making reading time quiz time—reinforce that reading at home is for pleasure.
- 10. **Avoid Screen time**—encourage them to use their imagination while playing.
