# Students Follow in Faith

Students at St. Mary School have many opportunities to grow in their faith. Each Wednesday students participate in Mass. All students take turns performing the duties of Mass such as greeting, reading, singing, bringing up the gifts, and serving. Older students sit with younger students to mentor them in proper Mass etiquette and to help build confidence in their Mass duties.

With Mary as the patron saint of the school, students begin their relationship with Mary early on. Praying the Rosary is done within the classrooms and as a whole school. In January the students were instructed on how to pray and be a part of the Living Rosary. Each student in the school received a schedule and rosary and were encouraged to bring it home and make it a special time with family members.





During the Lenten season, beginning on February 20th, the 4th through 8th graders will take turns leading the Stations of the Cross. By walking the journey that Jesus took that day, may we all learn the true meaning of sacrifice and love.

On the first Friday of each month the students and faculty participate in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. This is an opportunity for the students and teachers to strengthen their relationship with Jesus through self reflection and prayer.




## Mardi Gras 2018

# Alumni

Clare Johnston is a 2007 St. Mary School graduate.

Clare attended college at The College of Saint Benedict/Saint John's University, where she majored in ACS Chemistry with an Industrial/ Materials concentration and a minor in Mathematics. She graduated magna cum laude in 2015. She had two senior theses. Her chemistry senior thesis was entitled "Synthesis of Sustainable Monomers for a Polyurethane" and her mathematics senior thesis was entitled "Matrix Mechanics Analysis of Quantum Phenomena." In the spring of 2014, she studied abroad for 5 months in Cork, Ireland and traveled to 7 other countries during her time abroad. During college she was awarded the Regent's Trustees scholarship, Saint's scholarship, 3M National Merit Scholarship, the CSB/SJU Chemistry Department Award for Distinction in First Year Chemistry, the Abbott John Klassen Summer Research Award, and she was inducted into the prestigious Phi Beta Kappa Academic Honor Society.

After graduation she was accepted into the Chemistry PhD program at the University of Minnesota. She earned her Master of Science degree in Chemistry in February 2017. Her thesis was entitled "The Evolving Reactivity of Goethite Nanoparticles in Model Environmental Remediation Systems." She is currently a PhD candidate in the Penn Lab working on an environmental/materials project that builds off of her Master's thesis.
