



2018 Spring MAP Scores



The 8th Grade Spring MAP average Mean scores in Math, Reading, Language, and Science are once again above both the Diocese of Superior and National Mean scores. This is a prime example of the academic excellence that is offered in an education from St. Mary School. To ensure that this level of excellence is maintained, new Social Studies textbooks for grades K-8 and new textbooks for Middle School Health were purchased for the upcoming school year. New additions to technology education are one to one Chromebooks for students in grades 3-8 and keyboarding classes for grades 4-6. St. Mary School will also be adding the curriculum of Theology of the Body to 7th grade religion classes and retreats will be held at each grade level in the middle school. Our goal is to educate the whole child; mind, body, and spirit.
